## Discussion Guide | December 10, 2017

### Read together Romans 14

The Bible is crystal clear on the most important truths of life. Areas that relate to who God is, what His purposes are, and how we can be saved are not up for debate. However, God does not answer all of our questions. There are disputable matters of the law (see Rom. 14:1). The Apostle Paul addresses the challenges of how to best relate to one another when we differ in disputable opinions on what is right and wrong.

### Fully Convinced - Part Two

1. What was the most significant take-away from this sermon?
2. We live at a time in our culture when simply disagreeing with someone is labeled an act of hate. Describe the difference between making a judgement of what is right and the sin of judging another person?
3. Have you seen damage done to our spiritual health as a church by the quarreling over disputable matters? If so, how could the disagreement be handled differently?
4. Pastor Ken drew out some principles to help provide a framework for how we are to relate with others who disagree on what is right and wrong. What might some of these principles be? Where is the line when we must take a stand out of love for the other person?
5. At the end of verse 5, Paul writes, "Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind." Why is this important?

1. What has God been showing you this past week through His word, through life situations at home, work, church, or through other means?
2. Are there any things in your life or family we can celebrate together - spiritual or otherwise?
3. Are there any struggles or hardships in your life or family that we can pray for - spiritual or otherwise?
