Paul has urged the Galatian Christians not to grow tired of doing good, through the power of God's Spirit. It will pay off when the "crops" come, he has assured them. The most obvious crop is their own eternal life in Christ. Paul perhaps also has other positive results in mind, including the eternal lives of others who will come to Christ. And, perhaps he has in mind the rewards given by God to those Christians who serve well in this life (Matthew 6:19–20).

In any case, a planting season only lasts so long. It must eventually come to an end. Paul says this, spiritually speaking, is the planting time. As long as we have the opportunity to do good, to invest our lives by the power of God's Spirit in doing what is right, we should take it. This includes doing good to everyone but being especially intentional about doing good to and for other believers.

Paul describes all of us who are in Christ as belonging to the "household of faith." In Christ, we are siblings, and God is our Father. Doing good to others in our household is an investment that will pay off for them and for us both now and for eternity.

PLAN FOR A POWER OUTAGE

Are you prepared to get through a day or two with no electricity without risking your health and safety? Winter weather can portend severe problems and strike an area without much advance notice. Frozen and downed power lines can severely im-



pact your life and safety— especially when temperatures drop to negatives with wind-chill factors added. Plan ahead by following these easy steps:

- Stock the basics Keep a cushion of nonperishable food in your pantry that doesn't require cooking. Options include canned goods, nuts, peanut butter and dried fruit. Keep a few gallon jugs of water in storage. Have battery-powered LED flashlights available with fresh batteries on hand.
- Keep the fridge closed Left shut, it will keep cool for about 4 hours without power. A full freezer will maintain its temperature for around 48 hours (24 hours if half-full) if the door remains closed. If you have temperature-sensitive medications, note the total power outage time and if the medication has previously been used or is unopened. Then contact your pharmacist to determine if the drug needs to be replaced.
- Guard against carbon monoxide poisoning Never heat your home with your oven or run a generator, grill or other outdoor device inside your home. Have at least one working carbon monoxide detector, and test its batteries twice a year.
- Have a plan for electricity-dependent medical devices The Food and Drug Administration has a booklet designed for people to record relevant information about their devices, so they're prepared in case of a power outage. View and print the booklet at <u>www.fda.gov/media/80782/</u> download.
- Know your community Stay aware of community safe spots to go to for heat, air-conditioning, food and lodging. Keep a paper contact list of people and places you can turn to for help; leaving your contacts on your phone will only help as long as your phone stays charged.

Staying aware of changing weather patterns and special alerts so that you can make the necessary preparations is what will keep you safe and healthy during the short-term inconvenience. A change: Juan and Elena Felipe had been planning to retire and move to Texas where they have some relatives. But now they are thinking of staying in Min-





nesota, not retiring, with Juan continuing as Pastor of the Spanish speaking church that meets at Faithbridge! We did not learn of their decision until after the budget for 2025 was set, so it was too late to increase their support for 2025.

In the past, individuals have given to them by giving through Faithbridge church with a designation for them written in on the offering envelope. If any of you feel led by God to give to them this way, it would help them with financial needs this year.

Looking ahead: A snack drive for Red River Youth for Christ is planned for March 9-23 at our church. The snacks are used as rewards for the teens for memorizing Scripture. Here's a photo of the last time we had a snack drive for them. Lets do it



again and bless these young people. Start looking for sales this month on snack items!




